- "...there's a certain invitation and especially as we get older to self forgetfulness a little bit. You know, life isn't about me."
- "...the only thing on my bucket list, really, is I want to learn to be present."
- "...I think I tried to please too many people..."
- "...I feel that I'm on the threshold of newness all the time."
- "...there are diminishments, and I'm learning not to fight them, to welcome them, but there's also an expansion in my world..."

Further reflection:

Trevor says he used to have a certain level of discontent in his life – a joy
deficit – and he feels a big invitation in his life to live as a joyful human being
as he grows older.
